HOMELESS WOMEN IN DC NEED YOUR HELP

Did you know that over 32% of those experiencing homelessness in the District of Columbia are women¹? That means over 1,585 women are living on the streets of DC on any given night of the year. Not only are these mothers and daughters without a roof over their heads, many are victims of gender-based violence, and more than half have a mental illness, addiction or other serious health condition.

What's worse is mental illness and addiction among women has been on the rise². Housing is only the first step to freeing someone from the grips of homelessness for good. Serious mental and physical illnesses can make staying housed in the long-term very difficult. That's why addressing both housing and health related needs is so important. But in DC, there are currently more resources and support available for men than women.

But there is hope.

In 2019, Volunteers of America Chesapeake & Carolinas launched Hope Has A HomeTM in DC to provide homeless men too sick to be on the streets a safe place to rest, get the mental and physical care they need, and move into homes of their own. Building off of our success, we opened Hope Has A HomeTM for Women in January 2024 – the first of its kind to support women like Kyra in DC.

We are fortunate to have our partners, AmeriHealth Caritas DC, Developing Families Fund, the Morris & Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation and others to make this \$2.25 million project a reality. The program will offer the same care and supports as the men's version while also addressing needs that are unique to women, including reproductive health and trauma caused by initimate partner violence.

Only you can ensure this program remains open.

We are in need of \$50,000 to maintain this new safe haven for women. Only Beacons of Hope like

HOPE HAS A HOME™ – HOW & WHY IT WORKS

Homeless individuals are four times more likely to visit an emergency room and five times more likely to be hospitalized - typically involving a longer than average length of stay at a cost of roughly \$3,000/day1. For most patients, and certainly those with stable housing, the primary criterion for hospital discharge is health status. In other words, is the patient well enough to go home?

The situation for homeless individuals is very different. Even if they are well enough by medical standards for discharge, care providers often have no place to arrange for them to heal in a safe and supported environment. Medical respite is designed to provide that safe, supported and recuperative environment.

A partnership among VOA Chesapeake & Carolinas, AmeriHealth Caritas DC, CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield, Unity Health Care and Pathways to Housing DC, Hope Has A Home™ for Men relies on the Housing First Model. It's also low-barrier, meaning that we take on individuals whether they are actively working on recovery or not.

The goal of the program is to meet homeless individuals where they are and provide them the individualized support they need to progress through the program, regain their health and transition into housing.

The current program has two phases. Phase 1, "Medical Respite", provides individuals discharged from hospital the medical and mental health support they need to recover. Phase 2, "Step Down", is designed to prepare individuals who have recovered from their conditions to move into their own home and address any other social barriers they may have for success.

I had been in and out of the hospital several times and this program gave me a place to get back on my feet. I think this program would be great for women. Gregory





A PROGRAM LED BY WOMEN, FOR WOMEN

Some of the key barriers and challenges that homeless women face include higher rates of victimization due to domestic and sexual violence.

If you think that's bad, then this is the program for you.

Homeless women are also at risk of poor health during their reproductive years due to a lack of preventive care such as prenatal, mammograms and other tests. They also often lack access to menstrual products. Also, in general, women often need greater care and time than men to recover and get connected to services. Therefore, they often need more intensive support and time to recover from a medical condition.

Here's how Hope Has A Home™ will be a gamer-changer for women:

• Led by women, for women

An all-female staff of nurses, service coordinators and housing specialists will provide the full range of support vulnerable women need to heal and be successful.

Access to care women need


All medical services, including gynecology, prenatal, mammograms and other primary care services will be provided by Unity Health Care, our nonprofit medical partner.

Addiction support from those with personal experience

Women will receive help overcoming addiction from our trusted and trained peer recovery specialists who have lived experience with addiction and sobriety themselves.

Direct linkage to housing

Our nonprofit housing partner, Pathways to Housing DC, will ensure the women are placed into housing by the end of the program and remain housed.
