The Baltimore City Mayor's Office of Human Services (MOHS) Continuum of Care (CoC) continually strives to enhance collaborative efforts to end homelessness throughout the Baltimore City metro area. The SSVF Program will enable VOA Chesapeake to serve as a central access point for homeless and low-income veterans and their families to receive comprehensive case management, assistance with VA and public benefits, and other supportive services they need to move towards or keep permanent housing and a better quality of life.

VOA Chesapeake has long been a vital partner in providing a continuum of services to persons and families in need in Baltimore through the Pratt House Transitional Housing Program, Paca House permanent supportive housing program and the Irvington Woods permanent supportive housing apartments. This proposed project is a natural step in addressing the needs of homeless and low-income veterans in Baltimore City, and we will collaborate with VOA Chesapeake to expand and enhance its veterans' services.
