Magazine*.

Mr. Hollerbach earned a Bachelor's degree in Accounting at Iona College, an MBA in Finance also at Iona and the Certificate in Environmental Studies at Johns Hopkins University. He is an active CPA and Chartered Global Management Accountant (CGMA), and is an adjunct professor at the Johns Hopkins Carey School MBA program. He is a longtime Howard County resident.
